IMPORTANT CLUB BAR LICENCE

The Club continues to welcome all friends, family and visitors to the Club throughout the season. There is nothing more pleasing than seeing the Clubrooms full each week, and at the end of the day the bar turnover supports the operation of the Club.

However, all members need to be aware that the conditions of our Bar Licence requires that all non-financial members of the Club sign the Visitors Book at the bar.

Should we get an inspection throughout the season, and we are seen to be serving any person who is un-financial, or alternatively has not signed the Visitors Book, could lead to a fine and closure of the Bar for a period.

We therefore appeal to all members to -

- (a) Carry their Membership Card on them at all times (issued on payment of annual subscription)
- (b) When bringing visitors to the Club, please ensure they sign the Visitor's Book in the Foyer each time they come along. The alternative is to get them to sign up as a social member for a cost of \$25.

Please don't be offended if Bar Staff ask for your membership card during the season.

The Bar is licenced to 11pm each night, so please don't be offended if Bar staff ask you to leave at our official closing time. It is important we stick to the requirements of our licence.

All members are also reminded that the only place we are licenced to consume alcohol over the course of the season is the UPSTAIRS LOUNGE so drinking must be limited to this area

Over the past few weeks, a number of members have been seen bringing alcohol they have purchased from another outlet on to the Club grounds, cark park and in the Clubrooms. This must stop IMMEDIATELY as it is breaking the Club Licence we operate under and is placing us at risk of being closed down.

It is embarrassing to also mention that some of our own members think it is satisfactory to throw empty bottles all around the car park gardens as well – I wonder if they do that around their own homes!

The Management Committee will be discussing taking Disciplinary Action against members breaking these rules.


NEW BRIGHTON RUGBY CLUB APP

CONVERSION OF NBRFC CLUBROOMS TO ECSR HUB

Some Background-

In February 2008, a special AGM of the Rugby Club agreed to become a founding member of a new entity, Rawhiti Community Sports Inc (RCSI), which was formed to drive the project on Rawhiti Domain. The initial RCSI Board consisted of two rugby club members, Wayne Turner and Ceddy Smith, and founding clubs joining rugby were New Brighton Cricket, New Brighton Netball, Parklands-Christchurch United Softball, New Brighton Bowling Club and Rawhiti Golf Club.

The objectives of RCSI were -

- Administering and operating the Facilities in a manner agreed to by the members.
- To provide information and assistance, resources and opportunities for communication with and between the members of Rawhiti Community Sport Inc.
- > To meet and promote the interests of its membership.
- Through the provision of those facilities:
 - (a) assisting in and fostering the development and growth of sports, recreation and leisure-time activity;
 and
 - (b) improving the conditions of life for the people in the community."
- To do all such things and undertake such activities as are necessary, incidental, or conductive to the advancement of these objects.

In 2016, RCSI was changed to Eastern Community Sport & Recreation (ECSR) to reflect the fact that it has a much wider focus than just Rawhiti.

Ultimately, ESCR and New Brighton Rugby still had a desire to find a facility that could also be made available to the founding clubs, and other affiliates and community groups. The rugby club management committee still believed that the best way of securing the Club's future was to be part of a wider group of Clubs based in a single facility, commonly called "Sportsville".

The rugby club was in the unique position of being the only one of the ECSR clubs that had a clubrooms, so the most logical step was for our building to become the base for all the Clubs. The benefits would be that the building would be used 12 months of the year, and the rugby club could share the financial burden associated with owning an aging building.

In October 2018, a special AGM duly endorsed the following motion -

"New Brighton Rugby Football Club Incorporated supports the conversion of the New Brighton Rugby Football Clubrooms to the Eastern Community Sports Hub for use of all member Clubs"

This was a courageous decision, but one that simply had to be made as the club had been consuming its reserves each season over many years, and that simply wasn't a financially sustainable proposition if the club was going to survive in the long term.

This Special AGM agreement thus put in motion a good amount of effort to secure funding to allow the building to be upgraded, to complete some long overdue repairs and make the building suitable for multiple clubs. Over the following six months, around \$400,000 of grant funding was secured.

Even with this funding secured, the project was still massively short of funds to complete the fit-out of the building. Alongside the desire to refit the old downstairs lounge, rugby also had a desire to add two more changing rooms, and make some changes to the training field surface, and lights on Thomson Park. It was then that COVID struck, and falling out of that most difficult time, was a magical opportunity for ECSR and the rugby club.

Poto Williams, our local MP, had seen a number of projects in the East all struggle to get full funding for a number of projects that were underway particularly since the Christchurch Earthquakes. Poto saw an opportunity to consolidate all these projects together and make application to the Government Shovel Ready project fund given they were ready to progress straight after lockdown ceased.

An application for in excess of \$8.5 million was lodged, and \$7million was approved! ECSR benefitted to the tune of \$3.2 million that was to be allocated to the Eastern Hub (rugby building), completion of court resurfacing and a canopy over the old New Brighton Tennis Club courts and amounts for South Brighton Tennis and the Guardians of Rawhiti who were ECSR members.

So what has been done so far?

- New Roof on Clubrooms
- > Full internal and External re-paint
- New Commercial Kitchen installed on ground floor
- Fire alarm upgrade
- Additional stairs
- Refurbishment of the Old downstairs lounge
- > Refurbishment of front entrance and toilets
- > New fences and curing installed in the car park
- > New bar installed and contract signed with Asahi
- Air conditioning installed in downstairs lounge and upstairs meeting room
- A \$25,000 drainage repair that dated back to earthquake damage has been completed that we were not able to claim through insurance

What is still to be done?

- Two new changing rooms are being built (due for completion shortly)
- Thomson Park lighting is to be replaced and extended (due to be done around mid-June 2021)
- Current Training Ground to has been converted to our no.1 field
 - A small sum was spent on it to have ready for the Centenary
 - A full upgrade including installing lateral drainage will be completed in Spring 2021.

So far a \$800,000 as been spent with around \$400,000 to go!!

The most critical point in securing this funding was that it was approved only because the Club have moved to a Hub or "Sportsville" type environment, and funding was thus going to benefit multiple sports and around 1500 members across the combined clubs and affiliates.

Also watch out for the ECSR Canopy, located on the site of the old New Brighton Tennis Club, that is due to open in the coming weeks!!
