For those that haven't already seen details in the media, below is the recent announcement on the lease approval for the all-weather surface and canopy over the old tennis courts in Rawhiti Domain.

As a founding club of ECSR, we look forward to our members having the opportunity to use this space when it is built.

\$1.2m Rāwhiti Domain sports facility gets the go-ahead



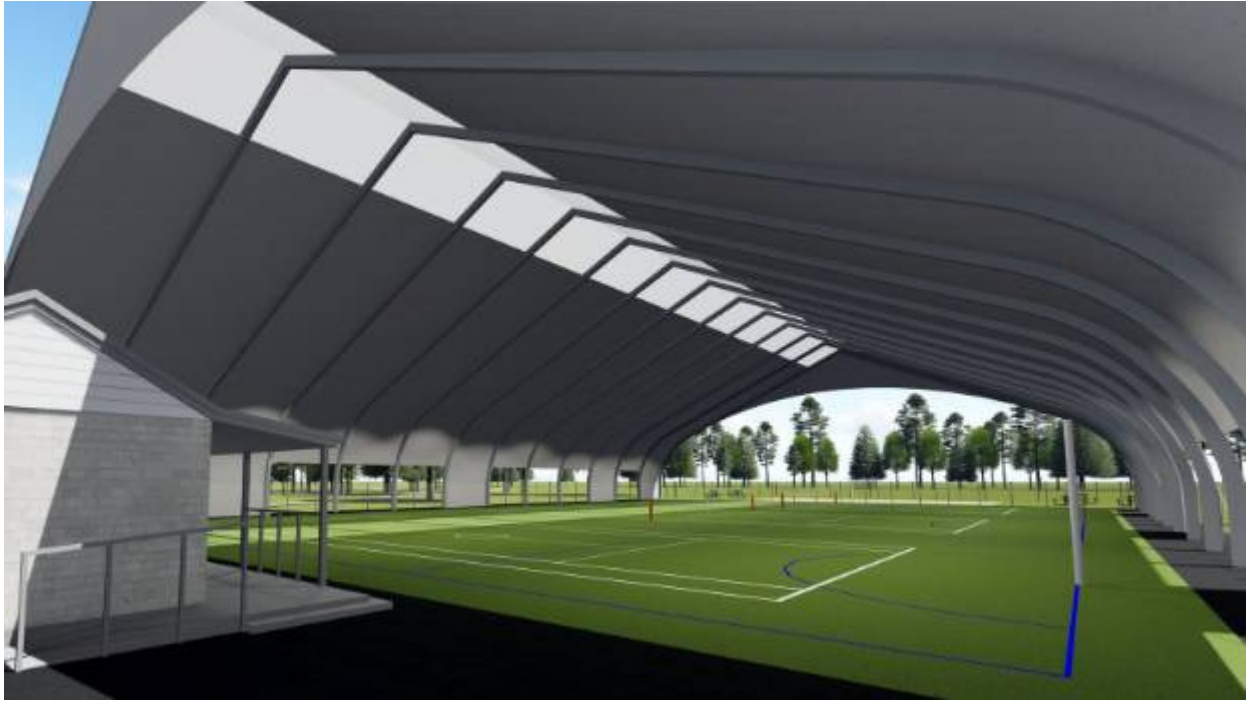
CREATIVE INTENTIONS

Eastern Community Sport and Recreation Incorporated will lease a section of Rāwhiti Domain in New Brighton to build a \$1.2m all-weather outdoor sports facility.

A \$1.2 million all-weather outdoor sports facility has been given the go-ahead at Christchurch's Rāwhiti Domain.

The Eastern Community Sports and Recreation Incorporated (ECSR) group hopes to have the facility open by April - but that will depend on raising the remaining \$525,000 needed to build the structure.

The Coastal Burwood Community Board decided this week to lease 3881 square metres of land at the New Brighton park to ECSR. It will occupy and upgrade four tennis courts, and build a canopy with lighting over three of the courts.

The group would also lease an additional 444m² of land in the domain to construct a radio-controlled car track and upgrade the sand volleyball court.

ECSR chairman Peter Burley said the board's decision was a great outcome. The group would proceed with building consent applications and hoped to start building by January.

"The canopy structure comes in containers from Canada. It's not going to take us a long time to build."

ESCR has already raised \$675,000 from the Rātā Foundation and the New Zealand Community Trust. It has applied to the Lotteries Commission for the remaining amount.

The board approved the lease after a hearings panel, chaired by Coastal Ward councillor David East, recommended it do so. The lease was for 11 years, with two rights of renewal of 11 years each.

Public consultation on whether the council should lease the land attracted 62 submissions. There were no objections to proposal, but some did have concerns about the reduced availability of the tennis courts for the wider public if the lease was approved.

ECSR was formed to bring New Brighton sports clubs together, including rugby, softball, netball, cricket and baseball clubs.

Bill Barry, Scott Taylor and Wayne Turner are on a working committee with ESCR to discuss development of the Clubrooms.

We will come back to all members when we are able to confirm any specifics

OXFORD GROUP LOYALTY CARD

The Management Committee have recently joined the Club up to a Loyalty Programme with the Oxford Group who own a number of bars/restaurants around Christchurch.

This scheme will act as a fundraiser for the Club as a proportion of all purchases made by Club members will be returned to the Club as a rebate. The Club member will also be offered a discount at the time of purchase as well.

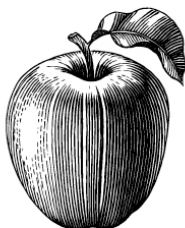

JERSEY SPONSORSHIP 2019

**Premier,
Premier Reserve
and Colts Premier**

As you will have noticed, a good number of Clubs have taken the approach of finding individual jersey sponsors over the past few seasons.

This past season was the first time we had actively encouraged players from Premier, Premier Reserve and Premier Colts to find their own jersey sponsor. For the first year, we had a really good result and the players efforts brought a whole new group of sponsors to the Club which assisted greatly with providing gear and equipment for these three teams.

We are therefore seeking player assistance again for the 2019 season!

We are asking all players in these three teams to attempt to find at least one jersey sponsor next season at a cost of **\$350 per jersey**. The \$350 raised will be split as follows -

- (a) \$150 - will pay for the players 2018 subscription
- (b) \$100 - retained by the team to be used at their discretion, but most likely towards team kit and running costs
- (c) \$50 - will be retained to pay for a sponsor plaque that will be presented on Sponsors Evening
- (c) \$50 - a fundraising contribution to go to the Club to assist with running costs and improvements.

Sponsors will receive -

- (a) Exposure through sponsor names on the back of the jersey
- (b) Name will be displayed on the sponsors board in the Club
- (c) Invite to annual Sponsors evening
- (d) Communication via Lupin Snooper newsletters

Given these jerseys tend to be used by lower grade teams after this season, the sponsors are exposed to spectators beyond just one year.

Players are asked to try and find a sponsor by **30 September 2018** at the latest so that jersey names can be printed on next season's jerseys when they are put in to production in October/November 2018.

If any member has a potential sponsor to offer please contact Wayne Turner ASAP.

Sponsors will be issued a GST invoice and payment won't be required until **February 2019**.

We are also keen to attract sponsors who might be able to offer a higher level of funding and may be interested in having their logo's on full team sets of training tees or hoodies. If you know of anyone that would be interested, please contact Wayne Turner (021) 748-144.
